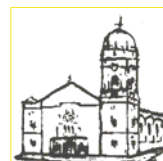

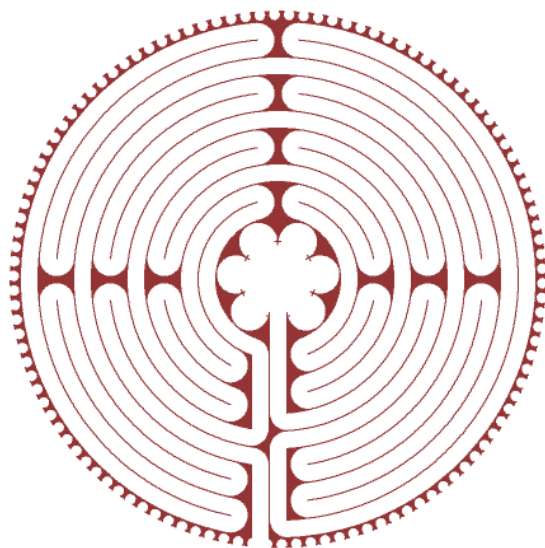

Church Construction Update

The exciting first phase of our Church repairs began four weeks ago with the assembly of scaffolding around the exterior of our Church by contractors Berglund Construction. Their work hours are 7 am to 2:30 pm. Work on the exterior of the Church began last week on the east side of the building and will continue, counter-clockwise, around the back of the Church. Work on the bell tower will be on-going during the project. This week, our construction crew will prepare mortar and sealant mock-ups for review and selection of mortar colors. Their work will include grinding at existing joints. An inspection opening at the 2nd bay on the east elevation will also be created this week for review of the existing underlying conditions at the structural columns. The exterior work on our Church is expected to continue through November, and we expect that the scaffolding will be removed by Christmas. More information will be provided in the coming weeks.

Three Year Board Positions:

Working with the Scriptures

June 7, 2009 (Mt. 28:16-20)

Although no one I know has been able to definitively find it in the sources, Francis of Assisi is supposed to have told his disciples to “preach the Gospel; if necessary, use words.” While no one can say just where the quote is found, most agree that it sounds like something Francis would have said.

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations...” For Christians this command, which comes at the very end of Matthew’s Gospel, constitutes our ‘marching orders’. What many people do not agree on, however, is just how we are to do this. Are we called to preach and teach in *words*? Or are we called to preach and teach by our *actions*? How do we “... make disciples...”? And where do we begin? Well, it would probably be a good idea to begin right where we *are* and, for many if not most of us, where we *are* is at work. So let’s start there.

Carolyn is a photographer. She photographs weddings, graduations, family reunions, Bar Mitzvahs, almost any family occasion you can think of. Not an unusual profession. There are many small studios like hers. What makes Carolyn different, however, is that before she ever sets up a tripod or positions a light she *listens*. She listens to brides and graduates. She listens to grandmothers and proud parents. Only then does she begin to photograph. I once asked Carolyn why she takes so much time with her subjects. I figured she could do a lot more business, and make a lot more money, if she would just use her head and be more efficient. Her answer surprised me, although it probably shouldn’t have. “Other people use their heads,” Carolyn said. “I photograph by *heart*. To me, each person who comes into my studio is Jesus, and I want Him to feel welcome here.”

“Go...make disciples...” When people hear that Carolyn is a Christian, they are seldom surprised. They can tell by the way she does her work. If Jesus were to walk into your workplace would He feel welcome there? What does your work tell people about *you*?

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
