Looking for Sponsors

Right now Casa Isabel is supporting three students, plus a mother and her small child. With luck, the mother and child will be able to move out this year and have sufficient funds to live on their own. We will continue with mutual moral support and a family-like relationship. This means that we will be able to open up three new spots for students in the coming year. Of course, to have more students we need more funding, and we are looking for sponsors to help support these wonderful young women in the continuation of their education. It costs about \$150 a month to help a student with housing, food, transportation, and education costs. The Mexican government has a program called Opportunities, which gives grants to students - \$50 every two months for middle school students and \$100 for high school students. Since the families of our students are very poor, we ask them to cover only the transportation costs if the students want to go home on vacation. We need to cover the other \$100 a month for the students. The best way to accomplish this is through individual regular sponsorships. Our United States partner in this project is Center for Sharing in Pasco, Washington. Donations may be made to Casa Isabel through this partner with the benefit of a tax deduction. It is an exciting year of growth and advancement as we have many projects in the planning stages for this year. With your generous support, the project will continue to run and grow. Working with the Scriptures

June 8, 2008 (Mt. 9:9-13)

“Just like Archie Bunker.” The words were out of his mouth almost before he realized it. The young man and I had been discussing the story of Zacchaeus. When we got to the part where the Pharisees expressed their disapproval when Jesus invited Zacchaeus, a hated tax collector, to dinner I compared it to Jesus’ invitation to Matthew, another tax collector, in today’s Gospel. The Gospel writer tells us that “... many tax collectors and sinners came and sat with Jesus...” prompting the righteous Pharisees, who only approved of people who thought like they thought and did what they did, to question the disciples as to why Jesus did this. And that’s when he said it. “Just like Archie Bunker!”

He must have seen the puzzled look on my face, because he went on to explain. As he saw it, when Jesus came along and exposed their prejudices, it made the Pharisees uncomfortable, just like it made Archie Bunker uncomfortable when his son-in-law did that to him. And so, the Pharisees reacted to the “...tax collectors and sinners...” just like Archie Bunker, by calling them names and refusing to associate with them.

That would never happen where we work, would it? We welcome everyone, even if they don’t think the way we do. We would never think of calling someone a name just because they have a different point of view or don’t keep the rules the way we think they should. After all, we’re followers of Jesus. We’re merciful. We eat with everyone. We would never act like those Pharisees, would we?

What’s that? You say there are some people in your office that you wouldn’t want to invite to join you in the cafeteria? Some people in your shop that you wouldn’t want to share a beer with? I understand. It’s not that you have anything against them. It’s just that they’re not good Christians like we are. Surely, what that young man said about Matthew and the Pharisees had nothing to do with us? We’re the *good* guys, right? We’re followers of Jesus. We’re not at all like Archie Bunker...

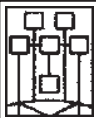

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
