Gospel for June 20, 2010

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lk 9: 18-24

Once when Jesus was praying in solitude, and the disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist; others, Elijah; still others, 'One of the ancient prophets has arisen.'" Then he said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said in reply, "The Christ of God." He rebuked them and directed them not to tell this to anyone.

He said, "The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised."

Then he said to all, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it."



After reading the Gospel aloud, in unison, those gathered reflect on the following questions:

- In this passage, what word, phrase or image struck you?
- How does that speak to you personally?
- How does that speak to our community at St. Athanasius? And to the wider Church?

*Conclude by praying the **Our Father** together.*

Scripture Question of the Week

Peter, often slow to understand, answers Jesus question without hesitation. But there is a twist: Jesus is not the military Messiah so hoped for. He and his followers will suffer before they triumph. Once we have answered Jesus' question, do we have the courage to accept the challenge our answer may present in our lives?

Working with the Scriptures

June 13, 2010 (*Luke 7:36 – 8:3*)

I went to lunch with a friend recently. It was a lovely day, so we decided to eat at a local restaurant that offers outside seating. The hostess greeted us at the door and invited us to seat ourselves wherever we were comfortable, and soon our waitress arrived to take our order. We felt welcomed and cared for – all in all, a very pleasant experience. How different it would have been, had the hostess ignored us or the waitress been rude. While neither of these young women probably makes much money, their attitude and demeanor reflect a most generous sense of hospitality.

“A Pharisee invited Jesus to dine with him.” He gave him no water for his feet, no welcoming kiss yet, because of his status in the religious society of the day, he was considered a man of some stature. On the other hand, the ‘sinful’ woman (did the Pharisee really have no sin?) bathed Jesus’ feet and anointed them with ointment. Jesus felt welcomed and cared for – not because of any action on the part of his prominent host, but because of the hospitality of the woman who served him.

Later there would be other women – “Mary, called Magdalene (not to be confused with the sinful woman in the Pharisee’s house)... Joanna, the wife of Chuza... Susanna and many others...” who would provide “...for them out of their resources...” Were they wealthy? Possibly. But it’s not their wealth that made them noteworthy. The women are remembered because, like the sinful woman, they cared for Jesus and the Twelve with great love and care.

The young women in the restaurant would probably never think of comparing themselves to the holy women in the Gospel story. After all, they were only doing their job. But in so doing they provided for us out of their resources of courtesy and hospitality. Do we do as much for the people we meet in our workplace? Do we welcome and care for our customers and co-workers? Or are we more like the Pharisee – quick to condemn others, but slow to recognize the Divine seated right at our own table?

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
