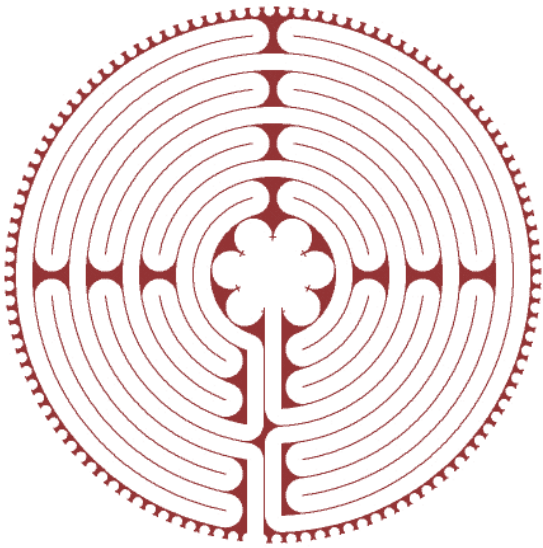

William Murphy to Discuss the Book of Revelation

Join us on **Thursday, June 25, 7-8:30 pm, in the Fitzgerald Chapel** for a discussion of the Book of Revelation or Apocalypse of John, sometimes thought of as the most confusing book in Scripture. For centuries people have tried to use it to predict the end of the world and explain whatever was going on at the time. Much of the imagery is lurid, violent or just plain weird, more like a horror film scenario or music video than anything sacred. Belonging to a genre of literature known as "apocalyptic," it has its own system of symbols and structures that supplies the keys for understanding the book in its first century setting. Discover the background for this book and learn how it relates to Catholic Christian teaching on *eschatology* – the end of time. William Murphy is a Loyola graduate, a member of the Chicago Society of Biblical Research, past president of the Religion & Ethics Institute and an Archdiocese of Chicago Master Catechist. The next time someone calls your favorite politician an "antichrist" or mentions "the rapture," you will have an answer!

Church Construction Update

The exciting first phase of our Church repairs began four weeks ago with the assembly of scaffolding around the exterior of the east wall and at the southwest corner around the bell tower of our Church. Our contractors, Berglund Construction, are working hard to keep us apprised of the progress of this important project, and to keep us safe as they work in our midst.



To that end, the following information is provided to bring you up-to-date with the current status and anticipated progress we will see this week. We will provide you with updated information and pictures showing the progress each week going forward.

WORK FOR THIS WEEK

Work on the exterior of the Church began last week on the east side of the building and will continue, counter-clockwise, around the back of the Church. Work on the bell tower will be on-going during the project. Last week, our construction crew prepared mortar and sealant mock-ups for review and selection of mortar colors. Their work includes grinding at existing joints. An inspection opening at the 2nd bay on the east elevation created last week for review of the existing underlying conditions at the structural columns.

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS AND ENDS EACH DAY...

Our crew is on site at 6:30 am and work begins at 7:00 am. The construction crew parks nearby, but not on our parking lot. Work ends and everything is cleaned up by around 2:30 pm. Berglund knows of any special events now scheduled. The exterior work on our Church is expected to continue through November, and we expect that the scaffolding will be removed by Christmas.

SAFETY NEAR THE SCAFFOLDS

Care should be taken as you walk near the scaffolds, being mindful that workers are overhead as well as at ground level. Children should be cautioned to avoid the scaffold area between the Church and the Parish House. They should **ALWAYS WALK THEIR BICYCLES** if they are entering the Parish grounds from Lincoln Street.

MASSES DURING CONSTRUCTION

Our 6:30 am and 8:15 am weekday morning Masses will continue as usual in the Church, for now, unless otherwise indicated. If the noise outside becomes too distracting, we will consider the possibility of moving the 8:15 am Mass to another location. Weekend Masses will proceed as usual. The windows on the east side of the Church will remain closed during this phase of our construction, and Berglund will monitor interior dust levels to ensure that dust does not enter the Church as a result of the grinding.

DUMPSTER, PORTABLE TOILET, CEMENT MIXER, AND EQUIPMENT LOCKER...

are all located to the west of the playground equipment, in the parking lot previously used by some of our teachers. This area is fenced off with chain link fencing, so that balls cannot roll in or near there. Workers will walk between the Church and this area via a narrow sidewalk, often with wheelbarrows to bring mortar to the Church after it is mixed inside the fenced area. Children should be cautioned to stay away from the area and the workers.

BIKE RACKS

There are bike racks located behind the Church, and outside the gym hallway. Please remind your children to WALK their bikes to the bike racks when they arrive on the school grounds. Again, children must not ride their bicycles under or near the scaffolding. We are exploring the possibility of alternate locations for additional bike racks, and will keep you apprised of this as it develops.

CONTACT INFORMATION REGARDING CONSTRUCTION

We are in daily contact with the on-site superintendent of the Berglund crew. If you have any questions or concerns about the construction, at any time, please call Janice Moore in the Parish Office (847/328-1430, ext. 100).

Working with the Scriptures

June 14, 2009 (Mk. 14:12-17.22-26)

“Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water.” That’s all. We’re told nothing more about this man. Apparently, his work is finished. “Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready.” Furnished and readied by whom? Again, we are told nothing more. “...and they prepared the Passover.” What did they do? What kind of work went into preparing the Passover? Small details, perhaps, but apparently necessary to the fulfillment of the covenant. Or why else would Mark have included them?

“A man ...carrying a jar of water.” Hey, Culligan man – did you ever think of yourself as being like that man who led the way for Jesus’ disciples? “...a large upper room furnished and ready.” I’m currently preparing to travel to Loretto, PA for a conference of Secular Franciscans. Do the people who will furnish and prepare our meeting rooms know that they are preparing a place for Jesus? “And they prepared the Passover.” Do the members of the kitchen staff at the university realize that they are preparing meals for Jesus and His disciples?

“While they were eating, he took bread...then he took a cup...and they all drank.” Who baked the bread? Who made the wine? Who went shopping for the food they shared that evening? Who prepared it? Did they have any idea for whom they were preparing the meal? Or were they just doing their jobs?

As I write these words I’m sitting at my desk at the parish. Earlier this afternoon a woman named Ruth stopped by my office to chat and share her story, which included several cancer surgeries and an auto accident involving a freight train when she was a girl. I was tempted to ignore her (after all, I have a column to write – it’s part of my job!), but something prompted me to invite her in. And I’m glad I did. Because Ruth was Jesus for me this afternoon, coming to talk with me right here in my office. “One bread...one body.” And I thought I was just doing my job...

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
