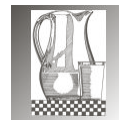

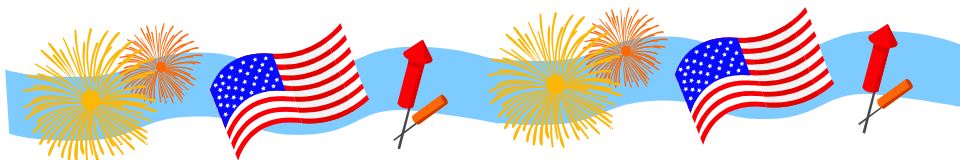
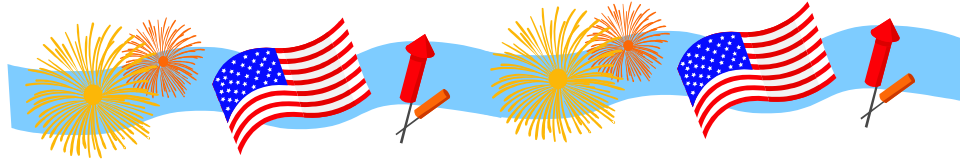

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES!

Last year, at this exact time, we were preparing for a Town Hall Meeting where *The Generations Campaign* was announced, funding priorities were introduced and volunteers were enlisted. Since that July 13th event, a great deal has been accomplished by our faith community.

Providing assistance in the vital roles of Leadership Team, Ambassador, Captain and Host, 56 individuals stepped forward and faithfully offered their time and talent in support of *The Generations Campaign*. Through the dedication of our Leaders and Ambassadors, more than 500 families had the opportunity to enjoy personal visits to discuss the campaign and the various components. These visits were wonderful outreach efforts allowing volunteers and parishioners to connect and share valuable information.

The personal visits – along with our subsequent Commitment Weekend, phonathons and follow-up letter series – have resulted in 404 pledges and gifts totaling \$2,404,985. And, of this amount, \$1,112,102 has already been received in payments. Because of this generosity of spirit, the exterior repair work on our beautiful Church is well underway and initial steps toward the official acquisition of Lindley Park have taken place. Let's pray that, before 2009 comes to a close, we have reached our \$3 million goal and are celebrating a job well done.

One year ago, *The Generations Campaign* was only a plan, the repairs to our Church a long-deferred desire, and the expansion of our campus footprint simply a dream.

Yes, what a difference a year makes!

Working with the Scriptures

July 12, 2009 (*Amos 7:12-15; Eph. 1:3-14; Mk. 6:7-13*)

They say that “life is what happens while we’re busy making other plans.” In the movie *It’s a Wonderful Life*, Jimmy Stewart plays a man named George Bailey. From the time he was a little boy, George had plans. He wanted to do great things, to travel to faraway places. But, life gets in the way. A childhood injury keeps him out of the military. His dreams of going to college fly out the window when his father’s unexpected death requires him to take over the family savings and loan. He even gives up his honeymoon trip to save his community when a run on the bank almost destroys the town. Years later, George finds himself still running his father’s business, and even a loving wife and children don’t seem like enough. George had plans. Now he wishes he had never been born.

Then an angel (well, not quite an angel) named Clarence appears on the scene and gives George a rare gift. George sees what life would be like – for his mother, his wife, his friends and neighbors – if he had never been born. It seems that God had plans for George – not George’s plans, but *better!*

“Amos answered Amaziah, ‘I was no prophet...I was a shepherd...the Lord took me...and said to me, ‘Go...’.” Amos was very happy tending sheep and dressing sycamores. But, God had plans for Amos... and Amos went.

“Life is what happens while we’re busy making other plans.” God had plans for George Bailey. And God has plans for us, too. God “...chose us...before the foundation of the world...” Clarence showed George all the good that had come from George’s willingness to do what he knew was right, even when it meant giving up his own plans. Are we as willing to give up our plans as George Bailey was? Or Amos? Or do we insist on having things our own way? Are we willing to go where God sends us, even when it takes us where we’d rather not go? Or do we prefer to just stay home and tend sheep?

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sometimes, it feels as if we live in a world of contradictions. Take traveling for example; the Boy Scout in us tells us to be prepared. This means packing for nearly every imaginable weather scenario from blizzards to sandstorms. But the practical person within us knows that the lighter we travel, the easier a time we will have of it. This is especially true if we're flying; between extra costs for extra bags and long lines at baggage pickup, we're better off with just a small carry-on containing the bare essentials. And really, don't we only need the essentials?

In today's Gospel, Jesus has gathered his Twelve Apostles together and is preparing to send them out to heal those afflicted with unclean spirits. He instructs them to carry nothing, only a walking stick, their sandals and a single tunic. He assures them their needs will be satisfied. Those who listen to their preaching will help them; but should their preaching be ignored, they can quickly and efficiently move on to the next person. In this lesson, we learn to rid ourselves of the excess baggage in our lives, freeing us to seek a closer relationship with God.

Jesus did not instruct his disciples to preach to any one type of person, he only gave them the power to cleanse the spirit. In other words, he sent them out to free the people of the burdens of sin and make them able to accept the many and diverse gifts of God. Each day, we are given a wonderful opportunity to cast off the burdens and the excesses of every day life - shake the dust from our sandals - to make room for the gifts of God. And with these gifts, we are also given the responsibility of sharing their beauty with all those who would listen.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
