Save Gas & Help Curb Global Warming

Summer's here and, unfortunately, so are high gas prices. Here are 8 great tips from AOL Auto to help you enjoy a road trip and still have some money in your wallet left over for souvenirs while also helping curb global warming by burning less fossil fuel.

1. Pack light. Extra weight cuts fuel economy, so pack as light as possible. Also, avoid hauling your stuff outside the vehicle. Roof-top bins and racks can cut fuel economy by about 21%.
2. Use the cheapest gas you can. Check your owner's manual for the kind of fuel your car needs. If the manual recommends Regular gas, use it. Putting in Premium just wastes money.
3. Use cruise control. If you're driving over relatively even terrain, cruise control can prevent unnecessary speed changes which waste gas.
4. Slow down. Even if you're driving at a constant speed, going too fast wastes gas. Within the range of normal highway speeds, each 10 miles per hour faster will reduce your fuel economy by 15% to 20%.
5. Calm down in town. When not in highway traffic, take it easy on the pedals. Aggressive acceleration and hard braking waste an amazing amount of fuel.
6. Use the AC if you want. It's debatable whether it uses more fuel to drive with your windows down or rolled up with the air conditioner on. So, cool down and enjoy.
7. Avoid getting stuck. Idling and slow driving wastes a lot of fuel, so plan to drive at times when there are less vehicles on the road. Turn off your engine if you have to wait in line longer than 30 seconds.
8. Give your car a check up. For reasons of both safety and fuel economy, you should give your car a good once-over before setting off. Make sure tire pressure is set correctly, the filters are clear, your fluids are fresh and the engine is running well.

Working with the Scriptures

July 13, 2008 (*Is 55:10-11; Mt.13:1-23*)

Was there ever anyone more dependent on hope than the farmer? This spring the Midwest has been inundated with water. Rain water, river water, sewer water, you name it and we've suffered through it. But while the damage to homes and businesses has been great the effect of the damage on crops was worse. Acres of farmland disappeared under the rising water. Television and news agencies carried pictures of fields turned into swamps, recalling images of rice paddies and cranberry bogs. And even when the water has receded, the cost to prepare the soil and plant a second time can be prohibitive.

Last week, I was listening to a radio talk show featuring an Agronomist and a Professor of Agriculture. Listeners were invited to call in with questions or comments. Most, though not directly involved in agriculture, called to express their concern about the situation and its effects. Then a farmer called in. He thanked the other listeners for caring, but wanted them to know that farmers have gone through this before and realized that they will probably go through it again. Instead of despair this man's voice was filled with hope. He explained that often it is precisely where a river overflows its banks that the most fertile soil is deposited. He then went on to assure the listeners that he and most of the farmers he knew would not be giving up farming because of one bad year. Rather, they would look forward to land made even more "...fertile and fruitful..." in the future.

That farmer understood the meaning of today's Scripture passages. The writer of Isaiah 55 does not speak of loss, but of hope. In the Gospel of Matthew we read about seed which "...fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirty fold." These are not hope-*less* but, rather, hope-*ful* words. The farmer who called in to that radio show had it right. He sees what others do not; he is not overcome by "...tribulation..." or choked by "...worldly anxiety..." His faith is sown in rich soil. Can we say as much?

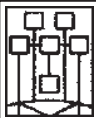

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
