**D**anny O'Shaughnessy grew up in Wichita, Kansas, the third of six children. He attended Duke University, where he earned a Bachelor's degree in English Literature. Danny returned to Wichita for a short time to teach English at a local middle school, but was destined for other work, including a period of time with the Outward Bound School. Ultimately, Danny came to Evanston to pursue a MBA at the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University. He achieved that goal in 1998 and accepted a position with Goldman Sachs, where he works today in private wealth management.

Danny met his wife, Jennifer, in Kansas City and they were married in 1996. They are the proud parents of four children. The oldest three attend St. Athanasius School: Ian (age 10) who will be entering 5<sup>th</sup> grade, Merrill (age 8) who will be a 3<sup>rd</sup> grader, and Claire (age 6) just entering first grade. Their youngest is Lael, age 2. Danny and Jennifer have been teaching the Baptism preparation class for new parents at St. A's for several years now.

The O'Shaughnessys have found the St. Athanasius community to be very inclusive and friendly. ## Working with the Scriptures

August 31, 2008 (Mt. 16:21-27)

She knew what they were doing. And she knew it was wrong. What she did NOT know was what she should do about it. So she went to her boss. What followed was not at all what she had expected. She had expected her boss to be surprised, perhaps even angry. But as she told him what she knew it became obvious that her boss had known about the mismanagement all along.

“You can’t let this get out; besides, it wouldn’t change anything.” She was in shock. She had come to him hoping for some kind of direction, some insight into what the next step might be. She had pictured the two of them marching into the President’s office to confront him with her evidence. Instead, barely able to believe her ears, she heard him say, “I suggest you go back to your office and forget everything you’ve told me.” “And if I don’t?” she asked. “Then it may become necessary for you to begin looking for employment elsewhere,” was his flat reply.

And so here she sat, across the table from this newspaper reporter, telling her story again. Only this time someone was listening. “What made you come forward?” the reporter asked. “You must have known you could lose any chance of ever working in your field again.”

“What made you come forward?” Hadn’t she asked herself the same question dozens of times? She’d thought about taking her boss’s advice and letting it go, but she knew she’d never be able to live with herself if she did that. She knew that this was bigger than her job, perhaps even bigger than her industry. There was more to this than money or job security. Did she want to lose her job? Of course not. But what would it have profited her to keep her job if, in exchange, she had had to forfeit everything she believed in? How could she have faced her clients? How could she have looked in the mirror every morning? “Whoever wishes to come after me...”

## Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

## Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

## Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

## The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

## Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

## Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
