Thank you for your gifts to the New Hope Apartment Fund Additional Funds Still Needed

Thank you for your generous response to our appeal for funds for the family in the New Hope Apartment program! Your contributions to date total \$4,712, which brings us to 79% of our goal of \$6,000 for our share of the rent for the family in this Catholic Charities program.

Your gifts are helping a young mother and her four-year-old son. The mother came to the United States from Eastern Europe at age 12, adopted by an American family. After high school she became pregnant and gave birth to her son. Her adoptive parents asked her to give the child up for adoption. This led to disagreement, and they asked her to move out of the house.

After beginning the New Hope program, with the help of a Catholic Charities social worker, she began working full-time in a deli restaurant, found affordable day care for her son, and started saving money. Her social worker calls her "highly spirited, courageous and focused" and says she is working hard, making progress toward financial independence.

Now she is expecting a second child, a girl, due shortly. In addition, her son has been diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). The mom has been working with the day care program staff on an Individual Educational Plan for the boy.

We partner with St. Mary's and St. Joseph's Parishes to provide funds for the family's apartment rent. The mother is most grateful to our parish for our continuing support of her family.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the midst of a lengthy political campaign, matters of public policy that are also moral issues sometimes are misrepresented or are presented in a partial or manipulative fashion. While everyone could be expected to know the Church's position on the immorality of abortion and the role of law in protecting unborn children, it seems some profess not to know it and others, even in the Church, dispute it. Since this teaching has recently been falsely presented, the following clarification may be helpful.

The Catholic Church, from its first days, condemned the aborting of unborn children as gravely sinful. Not only Scripture's teaching about God's protection of life in the womb (consider the prophets and the psalms and the Gospel stories about John the Baptist and Jesus himself in Mary's womb) but also the first century catechism (the Didache or Teaching of the Twelve Apostles) said: "You shall not slay the child by abortions. You shall not kill what is generated." The teaching of the Church was clear in a Roman Empire that permitted abortion. This same teaching has been constantly reiterated in every place and time up to Vatican II, which condemned abortion as a "heinous crime." This is true today and will be so tomorrow. Any other comments, by politicians, professors, pundits or the occasional priest, are erroneous and cannot be proposed in good faith.

This teaching has consequences for those charged with caring for the common good, those who hold public office. The unborn child, who is alive and is a member of the human family, cannot defend himself or herself. Good law defends the defenseless. Our present laws permit unborn children to be privately killed. Laws that place unborn children outside the protection of law destroy both the children killed and the common good, which is the controlling principle of Catholic social teaching. One cannot favor the legal status quo on abortion and also be working for the common good.

This explains why the abortion issue will not disappear and why it is central to the Church's teaching on a just social order. The Church does not endorse candidates for office, but she does teach the principles according to which Catholics should form their social consciences. The teaching, which covers intrinsic evils such as abortion and many other issues that are matters of prudential judgment, could not be clearer; the practice often falls short because we are all sinners. There is no room for self-righteousness in Catholic moral teaching.

The Conference of Bishops in this country and the Bishops of Illinois have issued statements about Catholic social teaching and political life. They are available in our parishes. All of us should keep our country and all the candidates for office in the next election in our prayers. God bless you and your families.

Working with the Scriptures

September 14, 2008 (Num 21:4b-9; Phil. 2:6-11; Jn 3:17)

My father-in-law died nine years ago. He was almost 92 and had been living on his own in a small apartment designed for independent senior adult living. Dad had some heart problems but, for the most part, was healthy and active until a few days before he died. Then, one morning he fell in his apartment and the EMT's were called. His doctor ran a series of tests. Dad was suffering from congestive heart failure and it was serious. The doctor suggested Hospice care. The Hospice nurse helped us to absorb the fact that Dad was dying. The nurse also helped Dad, a strong man who found the thought of having to depend on others for care humiliating, retain some sense of independence, even as he prepared for death.

My mother died four years ago just a few days short of her 90th birthday. She was living in Phoenix at the time and had been in adult care facilities for several years. A few weeks before her death her caregivers called me and suggested that it might be time to consider Hospice care for her. I flew out to Arizona to make arrangements and met the Hospice nurses who would be coming to care for Mom. They were wonderful, and over the next few weeks, they formed a deep and caring relationship with my Mom, with her caregivers, and with me. Mom was coming to the end of her journey, and she was carrying a difficult cross. The Hospice nurses helped her to carry it with dignity.

When I read this passage from John's Gospel, "God so loved the world that he gave his only son..." I find myself adding under my breath "...and Hospice caregivers..." Signs of God's healing, these men and women empty themselves so that when their patients are "...worn out by the journey..." they might find in their final days some foretaste of eternal life. With skill and gentleness they offer the work of their human hands. Perhaps it is no wonder, then, that when death finally comes, God works through those same hands to lift the dying up to glory.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism

is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation

preparation begins in the middle of 7th grade and is celebrated during the winter of 8th grade. For adult/high school confirmation, call the Religious Education Office.

The Eucharist

is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Lori Goszczynski. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in 1st grade and is celebrated in the spring of 2nd grade.

Matrimony

arrangements are made by contacting one of the priests at the Parish Office. Arrangements a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning.

Anointing of the Sick

is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation

is celebrated on Saturdays, after the 8:15 am Eucharist until 9:30 am, in the sacristy near the front doors of the Church during the Holy Hour. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
