Pastor's Notes

Positive Financial Signs

I am grateful for all the testaments of stewardship generosity that are happening at St. Athanasius. In addition to recognizing the accomplishments of our *Generations Campaign*, detailed in this edition of *The Chimes*, I am inspired by the committed support for our school and our other parish ministries. I also see hope-filled early signs of restored generosity in our Sunday offering.


To attain a balanced budget, our Sunday offerings must average about \$13,000 a week. Recently, we have averaged a weekly \$1,000-\$2,000 shortfall. As you know, we have reduced expenses, notable by an immediate 10% salary cut for all pastoral and office staff. This is a hardship for many of our dedicated staff.

You are responding to our need. In last week's Sunday offering 130 St. A's households contributed \$9091.50. This compared to October 19, 2008 when 129 households shared \$8,207.35 with their parish. Also, 118 households who are presently using the automatic donation **ParishPay** program contributed an additional \$13,349 this month. This steady offering adds, on the average, another \$3,081 to each week's offering.

Thanks to all who are helping us approach meeting our budget.

We assist our parish by choosing to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, by praying for and encouraging each other, and by making the financial sacrifice that we can for St. A's and those in need. **Signing up for the ParishPay system** is a potent step that you can make to assist St. Athanasius. Thanks for the ways you share your blessings.

Next Sunday's Gospel – November 1, 2009
Solemnity of All Saints

Mt 5:1-12a

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying:

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me.

“Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.”

After reading the Gospel aloud, in unison, those gathered reflect on the following questions:

- In this passage, what word, phrase or image struck you?
- How does that speak to you personally?
- How does that speak to our community at St. Athanasius? And to the wider Church?

Working with the Scriptures

October 25, 2009 (*Jer. 31:7-9*)

While the news media tells us that the current economic situation is turning around, that's not the experience of many people who have lost their jobs and are looking for work. Every week, they gather around coffee and doughnuts with other job seekers – in town halls and libraries, restaurants and church basements. They gather to tell their stories and to share their frustrations. But, that's not all they do. They also gather to celebrate their successes. "Three people had job interviews this week and two others received job offers!" And everyone applauds.

These folks know about living in "...the land of the north..." that cold and distant place called the land of unemployment. Some come to these meetings "...blind..." seeking new ways of seeing themselves and their situation. Some come "...lame..." seeking skills and tools to help them get up and walk again. Some are parents – men who find themselves taking on the role of "Mr. Mom," while their wives struggle to support the family on a lesser income; women whose job loss has required that they give up the very childcare services that would have freed them to pursue employment. Sometimes there is laughter around the table, sometimes there are tears. But whatever their situation, whatever their burden, they stumble upon these groups, hoping to find someone to "...console them and guide them...on a level road..."

What does God look like? In the experience of these jobseekers God may look like the Business Services Manager of a State or County Agency; or perhaps God looks like an Executive Recruiter. God may look like a representative from a local university, skilled in identifying skills and connecting skills to opportunities or like the secretary who types up name tags for new attendees and keeps the coffee pots filled. But however these people may picture their God, there is one thing on which they can all agree. God continues to "... deliver his people..." and to bring them back from what sometimes feels like "...the ends of the world..." to a place of consolation and hope so that they may again "...shout for joy..." And everyone applauds.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please contact Fr. Rich Sztorc.

Infant Baptism
